Sunday School


Sundays 9;15 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.

During the 10:30 Sunday service, children are invited to follow the Children's Chapel cross for a kidfriendly church service held in a small chapel room.

Kids on a Mission

Second Sundays | 9:15 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.

Kids on a Mission meets every second Sunday of the month to participate in hands-on service projects, including stuffing snack-packs for a local elementary school, assembling "blessing bags" for our Under the Bridge outreach ministry, and writing letters to peers in the Head Start program.

Godly Play

4 year-olds-2nd Graders Sundays | 10:30 a.m.

Using props to present weekly parables to our four year-olds through second graders, Godly Play provides our children with opportunities to deepen their understanding of the Bible with visual comprehension.

Joyful Noise: Praise and Worship

4 year-olds-5th Graders Second Sundays | 10:30 a.m.

The Children's Chapel and Godly Play groups meet on the second Sunday during the 10:30 service to worship through singing, praising, and fun.

OUTREACH

Agape

The Agape Ministry provides assistance to the homeless and San Antonio families in need. St. David's supports this ministry by providing food, clothing, and financial support.

Meals on Wheels

Members of St. David's volunteer to deliver food for Meals on Wheels Christian Senior Services. Each week, volunteers give an hour of their time to deliver a hot meal to an at-home senior.

Trader Joe's Food Ministry

Volunteers from the church rotate the twice-a-week pickup of soonto-be expiring food from a nearby Trader Joe's. The food is brought to the church to be used for all food ministries.

Snack Pak 4 Kids

In partnership with Wilshire Elementary, a nearby school, St. David's provides snack packs to children who would otherwise go hungry. Members involved with this year-round ministry help provide food and monetary donations, as well as deliver to the school Wednesday and Friday mornings.

Exceptional Adults

Saturdays during the school year, Exceptional Adults meet at St. David's for fellowship and worship. The group is then transported to Fort Sam Houston Bowling Center for three rounds of bowling. Volunteers help with fellowship activities and transportation.

Mission Road & Parklane West

Mission Road Ministries is a non-profit community center that serves over 850 children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Volunteers from St. David's attend worship at Mission Road three Sundays per month.

Weekly eucharist is served by St. David's volunteers at Parklane West Healthcare Center, a home for short-term rehabilitation and long-term care.

Under the Bridge

The third Sunday of every other month, a dedicated group of volunteers prepares and serves hot meals to the hungry and homeless community under downtown's I-35 bridge. Youth and adults participate in this ministry, feeding around 200 people each meal.

In addition to the many opportunities for fellowship within our formation groups and outreach ministries, we also provide members with programs dedicated to simply being together — congregation-wide and as smaller groups.



Young @ Heart

Our Young @ Heart program provides a forum for senior members to come together for Christian fellowship, spiritual enrichment, entertainment, and learning.

The group meets on the first Thursday of each month in McAllister Hall between 11:30 a.m. and 1:15 p.m. for lunch and a program. All members and friends of the parish, 60 and better, are invited to join.

During the first fall/spring season (2018-19) we averaged between 40 and 45 attendees at each meeting, with a total of 81 individuals joining at least once.

Advent & Lenten Wednesdays

Wednesday evenings during Advent and Lent, our members gather in McAllister Hall for dinner, devotional, and a special program. The 2019 Advent program included baking cookies for first responders, assembling blessing bags for those in need, neighborhood caroling, gift-wrapping for Wilshire Elementary kids, and a workshop on coping with grief during the holidays.

Parish Retreat

Each year, our members have the opportunity to disconnect, reflect, and relax together on our annual church retreat. Retreats are held at one of our diocesan camp facilities - the last five years being at Duncan Park, Colorado.

St. David's Anglican-style music program features choirs for every age and ability, which strive to enrich our worship services. The adult choir sings weekly at the 10:30 service, while the children and youth choirs sing occasionally throughout the year. Our worship is led by a 2013 Johannus digital organ, built in the style of English cathedral organs. Instrumentalists, both from within the congregation and profressionals, occasionally participate in our music program, including on themed Sundays, like Jazz Sunday, which brings music to the center of our worship and fellowship - helping us connect to God in a more prfound way.

St. David's Episcopal School, a Parish Day School and outreach of St. David's Episcopal Church, has been serving children ages 16 months through kindergarten since 1954. Our school is dedicated to meeting young children where they are developmentally in order to help them experience success in their future school career. The dedicated educators continually strive to provide a superior learning and nurturing environment. St. David's philosophy is that learning is fun! We make early childhood education exciting by providing our students with developmentally appropriate classrooms and curriculum; experiences designed to develop children's natural exploration of the world they live in; taking advantage of teachable moments to foster children's ability to observe, discover, and experiment; and by teaching children to slow down, stop, look and listen. Our mission is to love God, love learning, and love our neighbor. With 230 students enrolled in the 2019-20 school year, we believe St. David's is a great place to grow!

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

Our four-year old and kindergarten classes take many field trips every year that reinforce classroom learning and expose them to the exciting world they live in.

Vestry

The 12-person vestry at St. David's, structured to represent the whole church body, meets once a month to plan and discuss church- and school-wide business.

Diocesan Council

At the annual diocesan council, which takes place in February, St. David's sends a total of 12 delegates and alternates to represent and vote on behalf of the church.

School Board

St. David's Episcopal School Board is formed by nine school parents, the church rector, senior warden, and head of school.

Sunday Leaders

Each Sunday, around 40 volunteers help worship flow smoothly by serving as acolytes, greeters, ushers, lay readers, oblationers, altar guild members, formation teachers, and more.

Stewardship Committee

The stewardship committee, made up of the rector, senior warden, treasurer, and committee chairs, is designed to lead and educate the church on annual giving.

Daughters of the King

The St. David's chapter of Daughters of the King, comprises 12 members who are dedicated to prayer and service.

THE SEARCH FOR OUR NEXT RECTOR

In October 2019, the members of St. David's gathered to participate in a parish profile workshop. The purpose of the workshop was to talk openly about our greatest aspects, our greatest challenges, and what we hope for the future of St. David's. Below are responses that best summarize the views of the congregation.



What are the best things about St. David's?

St. David's, a neighborhood church, welcomes and invites all people to have a place to call home. Our open and inclusive community provides many opportunities for members and visitors to be in fellowship with one another by growing in our faith through outreach, formation, and worship.

Our outreach and formation ministries are strong and vibrant. Parishioners leading these impactful programs are empowered and dedicated to growing and expanding these ministries.

St. David's Episcopal School is a fundamental part of who we are. It is an integral part of our identity, history, and mission. The church and school have supported each other and worked along side each other for over 65 years, providing children and families a community rooted in faith.

prayers for the future

We pray that St. David's continues to bring people into the fold of Jesus by welcoming all to the table. We pray for a dynamic leader who will help us grow.

We pray for a rector who is energetic about continuing to build our relationship with the local community, as we continue to serve the sick, hungry, and needy.

We pray that our new rector will be dedicated to the spiritual development of our members. That he or she understands the importance of supporting our children, youth, and adult ministries.

We pray for a rector who will maintain a strong relationship between the church and school. Someone who is passionate about caring for and educating God's children.

What is the greatest challenge at St. David's?

Two Capital Campaigns, Growing the Tradition and Keep Growing the Tradition, helped raise funds for the construction of Lillibridge Hall at St. David's School. Though the new building has provided the school with needed space, we face challenges with paying the remaining costs. Additionally, the purchase of the church's adjacent residential property, which brings in rental income, has affected the finances of the church.

prayers for the future

We pray that as we move forward, there is more transparency on the state of the church and school finances. We hope to better educate members on the importance of pledging and committing to our church ministries. Our prayer is for a rector who will encourage and guide us in our stewardship efforts so that we can maintain a healthy financial position.

- 4. Help people see connections between scripture and their daily lives. Selected by 45% of participants.
- 5. Actively support outreach programs in the community. Selected by 37% of participants.



The Diocese of West Texas is guided in its purpose of being Jesus' witnesses by the core values of faith, scripture, prayer, sacramental worship, evangelism, mission, and reconciliation.





St. David's is part of the Episcopal Diocese of West Texas, led by the Right Reverend David Reed, 10th Diocesan Bishop of West Texas. The diocese comprises 85 parishes and missions, extending from the Texas-Mexico border to Brady in the north, Port Lavaca on the coast, and Del Rio in the west. The diocesan offices are located in San Antonio at the Bishop Jones Center.

ST. DAVID'S WITHIN THE DIOCESE

Located a short distance away from the diocesan offices, St. David's has a strong presence in the life of West Texas. Members from St. David's are on the development, finance, and christian formation committees; youth are actively involved in the Bishop's Happening Movement and summer camp; all ages participate in diocesan mission trips across the globe; and each year St. David's sends 7-12 volunteers to diocesan council.



SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

Founded as a Spanish mission in 1718, San Antonio is rich in history and culture. Along with historical landmarks, the city is rapidly growing and developing, with three Fortune 500 companies, the South Texas Medical Center, and a strong military presence. Today, San Antonio is the seventh largest city in the United States, with an estimated population of 1.5 million. Home of the San Antonio Spurs NBA team and the San Antonio Missions MiBL team, the city comes together to support local teams.

biggest Antonio's attractions include the annual Fiesta celebration, which draws in over 2 million attendees each year and contributes over 340 million dollars to the local economy. Morgan's Wonderland, also bringing in visitors to San Antonio, is the world's first ultra-accessible theme park, located in northeast San Antonio. The park opened in 2010 to provide children with and without disabilities an opportunity to come together for fun. Each park feature accommodates wheelchairs and other special needs.

TERRELL HILLS

Tucked away in the heart of central San Antonio, the City of Terrell Hills is a neighborhood community with an estimated population of 5,425. St. David's is the only church and only school in the city. Just outside of the city limits is Fort Sam Houston Army Base, University of the Incarnate Word, Trinity University, and the City of Alamo Heights. Terrell Hills residents are in the Alamo Heights and North East Independent School Districts.





RIVER WALK

The San Antonio River Walk covers 15 miles, from downtown to the historic Pearl Market. Explore by riding in a river barge or walking the trails. Along the river, you'll find historic sights, museums, food and shopping.

Each year, the San Antonio Zoo invites adults to Zoo La La! where over 50 San Antonio restaurants provide food and drinks. Stroll through the zoo and enjoy live music. Proceeds benefit the San Antonio Zoo, a humane certified animal conservatory housing over 750 species.
